FACTS ABOUT ST. ANTHONY ZACARRIA PATRON SAINT OF PHYSICIANS, FEAST DAY JULY 5TH

St. Anthony Zaccaria was a physician and priest from Milan in the 16th century. Anthony had a particular devotion to St. Paul and his teachings on Christ crucified. The love from St. Paul's teachings was the foundation for Anthony's work in hospitals and facilities for the poor. When Anthony founded the Barnabites in 1530, the community focused on this work, as well as reforming the systems of the Church in Italy in the beginning of the Counter-Reformation. Today, the Barnabites lean on Anthony's extant writings and sermons for their spirituality and devotion to the sick.



Every year on June 29, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, two of the most important apostles in the early Church. Though very different in background and personality, Peter and Paul are honored together because of their foundational roles in the spread of Christianity and their martyrdom in Rome.

Saint Peter: The Rock

Saint Peter, originally named Simon, was a simple fisherman from Galilee whom Jesus called to be a "fisher of men." He was among the first of the Twelve Apostles and quickly became their leader. It was Peter who confessed Jesus as "the Christ, the Son of the living God," to which Jesus replied, "You are Peter, and on this rock, I will build my Church" (Matthew 16:18). Despite his human weaknesses—most notably denying Jesus three times—Peter's heart was faithful. After the Resurrection, Christ forgave and commissioned him to "feed My sheep," entrusting him with the care of the Church.

Peter's leadership continued in Rome, where he guided the Christian community and ultimately gave his life for the faith. He was crucified upside down, as he felt unworthy to die in the same manner as Jesus. His tomb lies beneath St. Peter's Basilica in the Vatican, a testament to his enduring role as the first pope.

Saint Paul: Apostle to the Gentiles

Paul, formerly known as Saul, had a dramatically different path. A devout Pharisee, he initially persecuted Christians with zeal. But on the road to Damascus, he encountered the risen Christ and underwent a profound conversion. From then on, Paul dedicated his life to spreading the Gospel, especially to non-Jews (Gentiles).

Paul's missionary journeys took him across the Roman Empire, and his letters to the early Christian communities form a significant part of the New Testament. He boldly preached salvation through faith in Jesus Christ, emphasizing unity in the Body of Christ and the transformative power of grace. Like Peter, Paul was also martyred in Rome, beheaded during the persecution of Christians under Emperor Nero.

The Unity in Diversity

Celebrating Peter and Paul together reminds us that the Church is built on diverse individuals, united by their love for Christ. Peter represents stability, leadership, and pastoral care. Paul embodies missionary zeal, theological depth, and evangelization. Together, they show that the Gospel message is for all—Jew and Gentile, leader and missionary, shepherd and theologian.

Their feast is especially significant in Rome, where their blood was shed and where their legacy lives on. On this day, the Pope traditionally bestows the pallium—a woolen band worn by metropolitan archbishops—as a sign of unity with the Holy See and the successors of Peter.

The Feast of Saints Peter and Paul is a celebration of faith, courage, and the unbreakable foundation of the Church. Their lives inspire all Christians to remain faithful to their calling, to proclaim the Gospel boldly, and to build up the Church with love and humility. As we honor them, may we also strive to follow Christ with the same conviction that made these two men saints and martyrs.
