SAINT FRANCES XAVIER CABRINI FEAST DAY - NOVEMBER 13TH

Mother Cabrini's original name was Maria Francesca Cabrini, before she took her vows in 1877 and changed her name to Frances Xavier, in tribute to Francis Xavier.

She established 67 institutions – one for each year of her life. Her orphanages, hospitals and schools are located throughout the United States and around the world.



Mother Cabrini has four miracles to her name. She became the first U.S. citizen to be canonized a saint on July 7, 1946.

The Mother Cabrini Shrine is dedicated to Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini. It is located in Golden, Colorado.

Mother Cabrini dedicated her life to helping the poor, the sick, immigrants and those less fortunate. Her story is rich with determination, grit and an unshakeable faith in the Sacred Heart of Jesus



<u>"We Are the Living Temples of God"</u> The Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica:



We Are the Living Temples of God. On November 9, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, the cathedral of the Pope in Rome, often called the "Mother and Head of all Churches in the City and the World." While this feast reminds us of the sacredness of church buildings, it also invites us to reflect on a deeper truth: God does not dwell only in bricks and stones. He dwells in our hearts. Each baptized Christian is called to be a living temple of God.

The prophet Ezekiel once described the glory of God filling the temple (Ezekiel 43:5). Similarly, Saint Paul tells us that "the temple of God is holy, and you are that temple" (1 Corinthians 3:17). This teaching is both beautiful and challenging. It reminds us that God's presence is not limited to sacred spaces we enter on Sundays but is meant to live in our daily lives, in our words, actions, and decisions.

To be a living temple of God means to welcome Christ into our hearts. It means cultivating virtues like love, patience, and humility, and making choices that reflect God's will. Just as the Lateran Basilica was carefully constructed, cleaned, and consecrated to honor God, we too must take care of our spiritual lives. Prayer, the sacraments, and acts of charity are the ways we "consecrate" our hearts and allow God to dwell within us.

This feast also reminds us that being God's temple is not a solitary journey. Just as the Basilica gathers the faithful from all over the world, we are called to live in community. Our families, parishes, and neighborhoods are all places where the presence of God can shine through our love and service. Every act of kindness, every effort to reconcile with others, and every moment of prayer strengthen the living temple we are building within ourselves and around us. Today, let us take inspiration from the dedication of the Lateran Basilica. Let us remember that our true home of God is not just in majestic buildings, but in our hearts. By living as God's temple, we bring holiness into our daily lives, influence those around us, and reflect the beauty of God's love in the world. As we celebrate this feast, may we ask the Lord to cleanse and strengthen our hearts, making them worthy dwellings of His Spirit. May our lives shine with faith, hope, and love, so that, like the Basilica, we too can be a sign of God's glory on earth.
