

**St. Andrew Dung-Lac, Priest, and Companions, Martyrs
Feast Day November 24th**

Saint Andrew Dung-Lac was one of 117 people martyred in Vietnam for their Catholic faith between 1820 and 1862. Of the 117 martyrs, 96 were Vietnamese, 11 were Spanish, and 10 were French. Christianity arrived in Vietnam through the Portuguese, who came for Japanese Catholics who had been exiled from Japan. The king of one of the Vietnamese kingdoms forbade all foreign missionaries and tried to make Vietnamese Catholics deny their faith by stomping on a crucifix. Andrew was a parish priest who refused to deny his faith. The martyrs of these persecutions gave their lives for their Church as well as their country. They taught by example that they wanted the Gospel of Christ to influence their people and their country.

St. Andrew, you provided a wonderful example to your flock of a life lived totally for God. Pray that we may dedicate our lives to evangelizing the Good News of God's Love for us. St. Andrew, you did not let fear deter you from your work in God's service. Pray that we may not let people's opinions affect our actions or hinder us from carrying out God's will. St. Andrew, you shed your blood for the sake of the lamb; pray for us who still labor in the valley of tears, that we may be strong until the end. Amen.

"The Solemnity of Christ the King: Jesus' Kingship in Our Lives"



As we come to the final Sunday of the liturgical year, the Church invites us to pause and celebrate one of the most beautiful and powerful feasts we observe: The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. Before we begin a new year with the season of Advent, we look to Christ, our true King—our beginning and our end—to understand what His kingship means for our lives today.

When we hear the word “king,” our minds may picture power, crowns, or earthly authority. Yet Jesus redefines kingship in a way that surprises the world. His throne is the Cross, His crown is woven with thorns, and His power is shown not in domination but in self-giving love. He reigns not by force, but by mercy; not by armies, but by the truth of God’s compassion.

In the Gospel for this solemnity, we encounter Jesus confronted by those who cannot understand Him. Some mock Him, others question His authority, and still others remain indifferent. Yet in every moment, Jesus reveals the kind of King He truly is: a shepherd-King who searches for the lost, protects the vulnerable, forgives sinners, and restores dignity to the forgotten. His kingdom is not a political territory but a way of life—one grounded in justice, peace, and sacrificial love.

This feast is more than a reminder of who Jesus is; it is also a call to examine whether He truly reigns in our own hearts. Does Christ rule our decisions, or do we let fear, pride, or convenience take the throne? Do we welcome His mercy, or do we resist His invitation to deeper conversion? To say “Christ is King” is not merely a title—it is a commitment to follow His way, even when it challenges us.

Celebrating Christ, the King, urges us to ask:

- Is He the King of my family life?
- Is He the King of my worries and struggles?
- Is He the King of how I treat others?
- Is He the King of my priorities, my time, my choices?

At the same time, this solemnity offers profound hope. No matter how chaotic the world may seem, Christ’s kingdom of love is already at work. Every act of kindness, forgiveness, or compassion expands His reign. Every moment we trust Him, especially in our challenges, we proclaim that His kingdom is stronger than darkness.

As we close the liturgical year, we entrust our lives once more to Jesus, our King. And as we prepare to enter Advent, we open our hearts to welcome the King who comes—not in splendor or might, but in humility, peace, and transforming love.

May Christ the King reign in our hearts, in our parish, and in our homes—today and always.
